Pesticides and herbicides are designed to be toxic. The suffix 'cide' is derived from Latin: it means 'to kill'. Glyphosate is the most widely used herbicide in the United States, and can be found in over 750 products sold in the United States. This means that people can be exposed to glyphosate in numerous ways, such as:

Children like me are especially sensitive to pesticide exposure. I like to run and play outdoors, where pesticides are most commonly sprayed. Pesticides can really harm me, because my body - my lungs and my brain - are still developing and growing. Nationally, scientists have found the highest levels of pesticides in the bodies of children like me, compared to everyone else in the US.
